Cats Protection announces latest fundraising events

Following the book sale, egg-heads can show off their general knowledge skills at the quiz night which takes place at St James’s Church Hall in Wollaston. The quiz costs £4.20 per person, which includes a fish and chip supper, and starts at 8:00pm.

Rob Hall, Public Relations Officer for the Branch, said:

“We always get lots of books donated to our shop in Lye but since Christmas we seem to have even more than usual – they’re stacking up everywhere! So we thought this would be an ideal opportunity to create some space and satisfy local book lovers at the same time.

“This is the second quiz night that we’ve organised and, after the success of the first one last June, we’re hoping people will come along and show off their general knowledge skills (or not!), all in the name of fun.

“We’re hoping that lots of people will show just how much they care for our feline friends by joining us at these events. Rescuing, rehabilitating and re-homing cats and kittens costs us a lot of money so we will really welcome your support.”
